Attempts were made to see that all the teaching-learning, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities were done in accordance with the formed plan. All the teachers, also conveners of various committees, did all the activities sticking to their annual plans. They mentioned their daily activities in their academic diaries. The principal of the college checked their diaries on every Monday. Necessary suggestions and reminders were noted by him in the diaries. It was ensured that all the activities were done as per the plans.
