

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- The Library Committee looks after the facilities in the library, purchase books, magazines, journals etc.
- The Principal, the U.G.C. Committee, HODs and Committee Conveners work in co-ordination for the upkeep of the existing physical infrastructure and also workout plans for installing required infrastructure at the college.
- Wi-fi facility is there in the staff-room, science labs, computer lab and NRC room. ICT services are regularly updated.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- The teachers are allowed to attend refresher courses, short-term courses, trainings, seminars and workshops for their academic and professional development.
- Experts of various fields are invited for various curricular and co-curricular activities at the college.
